[33] (b) 'The Sanctity of Life is the most important issue to be considered in discussions about abortion.' Discuss. [17]

 (b) 'Soft determinism can easily be justified.' Discuss. [17]
 5 (a) Explain why people might argue that conscience is the voice of God. [33]

 6 (a) Explain how followers of Natural Law might approach issues surrounding sex and relationships. [33]
 - (b) 'Natural Law is the best approach to issues surrounding sex and relationships.' Discuss. [17]
