- 1 (a) Explain how and why Elijah confronted the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel. [25]
- (b) 'Elijah's confrontation with King Ahab at Naboth's vineyard had more religious significance than what happened on Mount Carmel.' Discuss. [10]
- 2 (a) Explain what the book of Job teaches about G-d and suffering. [25]
- (b) 'The story of Job was not meant to be taken as historical.' Discuss. [10]
- 3 (a) Explain the significant features of the covenants G-d made with Abraham. [25]
- (b) 'The covenants with Abraham were promises on the part of G-d, not two-way agreements.' Discuss. [10]
- 4 (a) Explain the main ideas in Jeremiah chapter 31. [25]
- (b) To what extent might the covenant in Jeremiah chapter 31 be described as a universal covenant between G-d and humanity? [10]

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
