- 3 (a) Explain the relationship between G-d and the non-Jews as portrayed in the book of Jonah. [25]
 - (b) 'The main themes of the book of Jonah are the best guide to when it was written.' Discuss. [10]

- 4 (a) Explain the significance of Moses in the Jewish Scriptures. [25]
 - (b) To what extent would it matter if the account of the life of Moses was not completely historically true? [10]
