	<i>(b)</i>	'The teleological argument for the existence of God is a strong argument.' Assess this view.	[15]
3.	(a)	Explain how the Irenaean theodicy addresses the problem of evil.	[30]
	<i>(b)</i>	'There has never been a successful theodicy in responding to the problem of evil.' Assess this view.	[15]
4.	(a)	Explain why some people question whether mystical experiences are authentic.	[30]

(b) 'A mystical experience should not be devalued by the challenge of authenticity.' Assess this view. [15]
