1.	(a)	Explain how Aristotle's virtue theory can be used to make moral decisions.	[30]

2.	(a)	Explain how Kant's categorical imperative may be compatible with a religious perspective.	[30]
	(b)	'Morality does not depend upon religious belief.' Assess this view.	[20]
3.	(a)	Examine the ethical issues which arise from the existence and use of nuclear weapons.	[30]
	(b)	'The manufacture and sale of weapons is ethically justifiable.' Assess this view.	[20]
4.	(a)	Examine, from the perspective of at least one major world religion, the ethical issues which arise from stem cell research.	[30]
	(b)	'Research using stem cells is immoral.' Evaluate this contention.	[20]
