2.	(a)	Explain how Muhammad fulfilled his role as a prophet after the hijrah.	[30]
	(b)	'Muhammad was the author of the Qur'an.' Assess this view.	[15]
3.	<i>(a)</i>	Explain the practice and significance of salah.	[30]
	(b)	'Salah is the most difficult of the Five Pillars for Muslims.' Assess this view.	[15]
4.	(a)	Explain Muslim beliefs and practices in relation to divorce.	[30]
	(b)	'Arranged marriages ensure that divorce is rare in Islam.' Assess this view.	[15]

4.	(a)	Explain Jewish practices in relation to birth customs.	[30]
	(<i>b</i>)	'Traditional life cycle rituals strengthen Jewish family life.' Assess this view.	[15]
