1.	(a)	Explain the different types of 'laws', 'precepts' and 'virtues' that are found within Aquinas' Natural Law theory. [30]

2.	(a)	Explain religious arguments supporting the use of Situation Ethics in making moral decisions. [30]
	(b)	'Situation Ethics does not work in today's society.' Assess this view. [15]
3.	(a)	Explain how ethical decisions can be made using Act Utilitarianism. [30]
	(b)	Assess the strengths and weaknesses of Utilitarianism. [15]
4.	(a)	Explain attitudes within <b>one</b> major world religion towards gay and lesbian marriage and civil partnerships. [30]
	(b)	'The move away from traditional heterosexual marriage has been beneficial for society.' Assess this view. [15]
