1. Religious Authority

You must explain, exemplify (give examples) and comment on the different ways specific types of religious authority influence religious believers. Also evaluate the extent to which any religious authority can be considered really authoritative in the 21st century.

- (a) Examine in detail different ways in which specific types of religious authority influence religious believers. [45]
- (b) 'In the 21st century religious authority is no longer respected.'
 Evaluate this statement. [30]

2. Religious Experience

You must explain, exemplify (give examples) and comment on the nature of different types of religious experience. Also evaluate whether an understanding of the nature of God/Ultimate Reality can be reliably gained through a religious experience.

(The term 'Ultimate Reality' is used as an alternative for 'God' to allow for a non-theistic perspective.)

- (a) Examine in detail the nature of different types of religious experience. [45]
- (b) 'A religious experience is not a reliable way to understand the nature of God/Ultimate Reality.'
 Evaluate this statement. [30]

3. Life, Death and Life after Death

You must explain, exemplify (give examples) and comment on specific religious teachings about the nature and purpose of life. Also evaluate whether the way that religious persons live their lives is entirely influenced by their belief about life after death.

- (a) Examine in detail specific religious teachings about the nature and purpose of life. [45]
- (b) 'Belief in life after death is the single most important influence on how religious believers live their lives.'
 Evaluate this statement. [30]
