	(b)	'Old Testament concepts of God are irrelevant today.' Evaluate the validity of this statement.	[20]
3.	(a)	Examine similarities and differences between the prophets Elijah and Elisha.	[30]
	(b)	'The eighth century prophets were completely different from Elijah and Elisha.' Assess this view.	[20]
4.	(a)	Explain how the main themes of either Jeremiah or Ezekiel were relevant to the tim which they lived.	es in [30]

(b) 'The prophet was more concerned with the nation than with individuals.'
Assess this view with regard to either Jeremiah or Ezekiel. [20]

4.	(a)	Examine Jesus' teaching on divorce in the passages that you have studied.	[30]
	(b)	'Jesus' teaching on divorce is irrelevant today.' Assess this view.	[20]
