1. **RELIGIOUS AUTHORITY**

You must show knowledge and understanding of the use of FOUR different types of religious authority and be able to evaluate the inherent strengths and limitations of individual religious authorities.

- (a) Examine how FOUR types of religious authority are used in religion. [45]
- (b) 'Religious leaders are the least important type of religious authority for religious believers.'
 Evaluate this assertion. [30]

2. RELIGIOUS EXPERIENCE

You must show knowledge and understanding of ways in which scholars have classified religious experiences and be able to evaluate whether it is only those religious believers that undergo religious experiences that derive value from them.

- (a) Examine ways in which different religious experiences have been classified. [45]
- (b) 'Religious experiences are very important even for people who do not experience them.'
 Evaluate this assertion. [30]

3. LIFE, DEATH AND LIFE AFTER DEATH

You must show knowledge and understanding of a variety of religious teachings and theories about life after death and be able to evaluate whether there is reliable evidence for a belief in life after death for religious believers.

- (a) Examine different religious teachings and theories about life after death. [45]
- (b) 'There is plenty of convincing evidence to support a belief in life after death.' Evaluate this assertion. [30]
