Item A

Social surveys are an important means of gathering local, national and international information. They cover a wide range of social, political and economic issues of interest to government, the professions, academics and others who need to obtain information. In the United Kingdom there are regular national surveys of social issues, usually based on the use of questionnaires or structured interviews. These surveys contribute to the considerable volume of official statistics now available to the researcher. For instance, the General Household Survey has been conducted annually since 1971.
