- 3 “Most types of secondary data are too subjective to be useful in sociological research.” Explain and assess this claim. [25]
- 4 “The values of the researcher greatly influence the findings of their sociological research.” Explain and assess this claim. [25]

Section C: Social Differentiation and Stratification

- 5 “Economic and cultural divisions between the working class and the middle class are disappearing in modern industrial societies.” Explain and assess this view. [25]
- 6 “Inequality based on gender no longer exists in modern industrial societies.” Explain and assess this claim. [25]
