You have been asked as a sociological researcher, to design a research proposal that will target an appropriate sample of homeless people. You are required to collect **quantitative** data.

- (d) Outline and explain the research process that you would adopt in collecting **quantitative** data to find out the needs of the homeless in your nearest town or city. [14]
- (e) Assess the potential weaknesses of your research proposal, briefly explaining how you intend to overcome them. [22]
