Social networking

Social networking via the Internet has become increasingly popular with people of all ages in the UK. Computers or mobile phones may be used. People may publish information about themselves so that this is open to the public or just to their online friends.

Researchers carried out **qualitative** face-to-face investigations to understand this new social behaviour. The research design included 12 two-hour sessions in which researchers observed their respondents' use of the computer.

The research design also included a number of two hour follow-up interviews with selected respondents.
