1. Look at the item below and answer the following questions.

Perceptions of youth crime

In 2004, Hough and Roberts conducted research on the attitude of the public to youth offending and the punishment of young people. They decided to use a **structured interview** approach and compiled 30 questions. Government-trained interviewers conducted interviews with 1692 people aged over 16. Each interview took approximately 15 minutes to complete.

Hough and Roberts found that people have negative perceptions of youth and the youth justice system. They believe that offending rates are higher than they appear and also that offenders are unlikely to be punished.
