# Unit 6 (6816/03): Writing in Registers

#### Assessment Principles and Mark Scheme:

- Only one question is to be answered
- All questions carry equal marks
- The total mark for this paper is 40
- Each question must be answered in Spanish (230-250 words for Qs 1-7, 200-225 for Qs 8-9)

Answers should be read once and assessed for **Content**.

Answers should then be read again and assessed for **Language**.

- Short answers Answers significantly <u>below</u> the specified number of words will be marked using a pro rata reduction of the possible maximum content and language marks.
- Long answers The essay / task should be read in its entirety. If in your judgement the candidate has gained any significant advantage in <u>content</u> by ignoring the word limit, the mark for Content may be reduced. In case of doubt consult the PE.

## Notes to the questions

#### [ 1-3: CREATIVE ESSAYS ]

#### 1. [Inundaciones]

- Straightforward task.
- Interview / dialogue format required.
- A specific incident is to be referred to. A (graphic) personal response is sought. Since the picture indicates a very serious flood, exaggerated language / reactions to be expected.
- Reference must be made to the level of 'normality' at present.

## 2. [Aeropuerto]

- A monologue format required, though it should be given in the context of addressing a public meeting.
- Why has there been such a reaction by locals? What would be the impact of such an expansion? What alternatives do the locals propose?
- A passionate speech to be hoped for!

## 3. [ Fotocopiadora - hoja de examen ]

- Dialogue format. Appropriate format and language required. (Abbreviations for speakers acceptable.)
- Sense(s) of surprise / delight / confusion / dilemma all likely.
- Need to know what candidate intends to do next.

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#### [ 4-7: DISCURSIVE ESSAYS ]

#### 4. [Inquietud ciudadana]

- Very straightforward task.
- Likely to prove popular.
- How accurate is the statement?
- Candidates can be expected to take up some of the words (hopefully, not all) and are likely to give (anecdotal) support to their opinion. [Remember the question asks them to *justify* their opinion.]

## 5. [Pobreza]

- Again, could prove to be very popular.
- Candidates who answer this question are likely to be intense / passionate in their response. Again, anecdotal material acceptable.
- Sueño / realidad candidates must come down on one side or the other.

## 6. [ Proteger animales / derechos ... seres humanos ]

- Candidates must react to the statement. Are there such differences (of opinion)? How irreconcilable are they?
- Note the second part of the question: candidates need to offer reasons and solutions.

#### 7. [ <u>Dinero ... deporte profesional</u> ]

- Straightforward task.
- Very hot potato at present: plenty of issues, aspects to be discussed.
- Candidates can refer to any relevant context and sport football will be the most frequently mentioned (national / international).
- A reasoned answer sought (*diversión / negocio ... comercial* need to be debated).

#### [ 8-9: TASK-BASED ASSIGNMENTS ]

#### 8. TBA 1 [ Grupo Lorenzo ]

All the bullet points clearly need to be addressed.

- A correct letter-format is to be adopted, including an appropriate start and end, appropriate register, and consistent forms (Vd., su, sus etc) for a formal letter.
- Make sure that candidates have fully understood the Task, and that they have (creatively) included 'other relevant information' (iv).

## 9. TBA 2 [ Miguel Campos / Mayor of Orlando ]

Again, all bullet points need to be addressed specifically - (iii) requires the candidate's own imaginative input.

- A correct letter-format is required (as for TBA 1).
- A formal tone for the letter is require
