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General Marking Guidance

- All candidates must receive the same treatment. Examiners must mark the first candidate in exactly the same way as they mark the last.
- Mark schemes should be applied positively. Candidates must be rewarded for what they have shown they can do rather than penalised for omissions.
- Examiners should mark according to the mark scheme not according to their perception of where the grade boundaries may lie.
- There is no ceiling on achievement. All marks on the mark scheme should be used appropriately.
- All the marks on the mark scheme are designed to be awarded. Examiners should always award full marks if deserved, i.e. if the answer matches the mark scheme. Examiners should also be prepared to award zero marks if the candidate's response is not worthy of credit according to the mark scheme.
- Where some judgement is required, mark schemes will provide the principles by which marks will be awarded and exemplification may be limited.
- When examiners are in doubt regarding the application of the mark scheme to a candidate's response, the team leader must be consulted.
- Crossed out work should be marked UNLESS the candidate has replaced it with an alternative response.

Order of elements applies to Q4, 6, 7: In a two mark question, always mark the first two answers offered and award marks for those, either both correct, one correct or none. Extra attempts are ignored, even if the given answer is correct.

In Q4 & 7 targeted lifts are accepted.

Spelling: Mis-spellings (including accent errors) are tolerated as long as they are not ambiguous or in the wrong language.

In Q4 and 7, infinitives, subjunctives and wrong tenses (unless a specific tense is required), can be accepted. An incorrect person or a non-existent form will not be accepted. Verbs with a vowel missed from a diphthong may be accepted as a spelling error, e.g. aprendó, se desperta.

Order of elements
Consider only as many elements as there are marks, e.g. for a 1 mark answer, the candidate's first response is taken for assessment, even if this response is incorrect but the correct information follows as a further element. Where 2 marks are available, award the individual marks discretely but apply the order of elements rule.
Targeted lifts
Targeted lifts are allowed in responses in Spanish and must be credited. This applies to both Q4 (listening) and Q7 (reading).
Mis-spellings
...are tolerated in essential parts of the answer, as long as they are not ambiguous or in the wrong language.
Omitted bullet points in Q8
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Max 9 for Content & Response if one complete bullet point omitted • Max 6 for Content & Response if two complete bullet points omitted. • If one or more bullet points have been addressed only partially (e.g. in a two part bullet point, only one aspect has been addressed), then max 12 for Content & Response.
NB: These are the maximum marks which it would be possible to award. They do not represent an automatic entitlement.

M: Juana, ¿por qué crees que no existen más mujeres en las fuerzas armadas?

F: Creo que es por falta de interés o por desconocimiento de las posibilidades.

M: ¿Cómo decidiste incorporarte a la Marina?

F: Habiendo visto a mi padre cumplir con su carrera naval, conocía las exigencias y los beneficios que implicaba. La posibilidad de viajar y la oferta de una beca de especialización médica fueron mis motivaciones principales.

M: ¿Has encontrado problemas para integrarte a esta institución?

F: Ninguno. Integrarse a la institución es un desafío para cualquier persona porque se exige responsabilidad, capacidad de organización y estabilidad frente a situaciones de conflicto. Ser mujer no me ha afectado para obtener puestos, ascender en la carrera, etc.

M: ¿Qué aportes crees que has realizado en las zonas de conflicto?

F: El hecho de mostrar que la presencia de una mujer en una misión no significa un estorbo ni un problema logístico. Que tener mujeres quiere decir que

hay más mano de obra competente, una actitud comprensiva hacia los compañeros y un apoyo en tiempos difíciles.

M: Finalmente, ¿qué te ha aportado la experiencia de participar en la misión de paz en Haití?

F: Tengo más seguridad en mí misma, cuando lo menciono, siento que se me mira y escucha con más respeto; además, al conocer la realidad de Haití, le tomé un aprecio inmenso a mi país... me he vuelto muchísimo más patriota y he aprendido a apreciar todas las pequeñas cosas de la vida, que cuando faltan, no parecen tan pequeñas.
