Seek as much information as the time allows but you must include at least one question where the candidate will have to respond using his/her own initiative. Draw the conversation to a positive conclusion at the end of five minutes.

The Task

You begin the task as follows:

- Is it best to stay in one place or try to go round a foreign country?

mean no parking at any time.




Single yellow lines

You may stop to let passengers in or out of the vehicle and to load and unload unless indicated otherwise.

Don't drive or stop in a **bus lane***.



Don't drive or park during stated times in a **cycle lane*** that is marked by a solid white line.



*Note: lane = carril
