### Spelling Instructions for Teachers – Year 3

#### Task A – Dictation

#### SAY

Task A is a Dictation exercise. We will complete this together.

Turn to page 11 of your English Test. Do not write anything yet. Some words are missing from the passage. Your task is to write the missing words in the boxes when I tell you. First I will read the whole passage to you. Then I will read it again slowly and I will stop at each box and tell you which word to write. You need to write the missing word in the box. Remember to write neatly so that your answer can be read easily.

Now listen while I read the whole passage. Do not write anything yet.

READ the following passage through once. The missing words are underlined.

Next <u>weekend</u> Joel and Carl are going to Brisbane. They <u>believe</u> that the <u>journey</u> will take them about <u>eight</u> hours. They will be <u>staying</u> with their aunty who lives <u>near</u> some great <u>beaches</u>. Joel rang his aunty <u>yesterday</u> to tell her their <u>arrival</u> time. She is very <u>excited</u> about their <u>visit</u>. She is looking <u>forward</u> to seeing them again.

#### SAY

Now I will read the passage again and give you time to write the missing words.

READ the passage in appropriate sections (as below), allowing about 10–15 seconds between each section for students
to write the word. Tell students that if they have not written the word after that time they should leave the space blank.

Next weekend – Number 1, the word is 'weekend' (repeat) 'weekend'

Joel and Carl are going to Brisbane. They <u>believe</u> – Number 2, the word is 'believe' (repeat) 'believe'

that the journey – Number 3, the word is 'journey' (repeat) 'journey'

will take them about eight - Number 4, the word is 'eight' (repeat) 'eight'

hours. They will be <u>staying</u> – Number 5, the word is 'staying' (repeat) 'staying'

with their aunty who lives <u>near</u> – Number 6, the word is 'near' (repeat) 'near'

some great beaches. - Number 7, the word is 'beaches' (repeat) 'beaches'

Joel rang his aunty <u>yesterday</u> – Number 8, the word is 'yesterday' (repeat) 'yesterday'

to tell her their <u>arrival</u> – Number 9, the word is 'arrival' (repeat) 'arrival'

time. She is very excited – Number 10, the word is 'excited' (repeat) 'excited'

about their visit. - Number 11, the word is 'visit' (repeat) 'visit'

She is looking forward – Number 12, the word is 'forward' (repeat) 'forward'

to seeing them again.





#### SAY

Now I am going to read the whole passage to you one more time. If you need to make any changes you can make them as I am reading. I will also give you one minute to check your work after I have finished reading. Follow silently as I read.

READ the passage again.

Next <u>weekend</u> Joel and Carl are going to Brisbane. They <u>believe</u> that the <u>journey</u> will take them about <u>eight</u> hours. They will be <u>staying</u> with their aunty who lives <u>near</u> some great <u>beaches</u>. Joel rang his aunty <u>yesterday</u> to tell her their <u>arrival</u> time. #### Task B - Editing

#### • SAY

Look at Task B on page 12. This task contains sentences that have some words spelled incorrectly. These words are circled. You are to read the sentences silently to yourselves and then write the correctly spelled word in the space provided. I am not able to read the sentences to you.

You have approximately 5\* minutes to complete this task. You may start now.

\*The teacher may vary this slightly to suit student needs.
