## **Learning activities**

Read Harapannya di Laut by B. Yass

Focus of activities – the interdependency between two social classes, i.e. the fisherman and the merchant.

Read Dian Yang Tak Kunjung Padam by S. Takdir Alisahbana.

Focus of activities – the determination of the two lovers to unite despite their different social backgrounds.

Read Layar Terkembang by Suparto Brata.

Focus of learning activities – the interaction between social classes, i.e. between the rich and the poor.

View Langitku Rumahku.

Focus of activities – how the two social classes of the haves and have-nots in Indonesia are presented.

## **Example assessment tasks**

**Outcome 2:** Respond critically to spoken and written texts which reflect aspects of language and culture.

- Write a 350–400 word evaluative essay focusing on how successfully barriers between social classes have been broken down.
- Four- to five-minute interview on an issue related to texts studied:
- 1. Education can facilitate change and break tradition, i.e. people can raise themselves from one social class to another. Discuss with reference to texts studied.
- 2. Determination can be stronger than intelligence alone. Discuss with reference to texts studied.
- 3. Learning opportunities are there to seize and utilise to achieve success. Discuss with reference to texts studied.
- 4. A social gap should not hinder communication as equals. Discuss with reference to texts studied.
- 5. Feudalistic values are deeply rooted across all levels of Indonesian society. Discuss with reference to texts studied.

- 6. There should be no grounds for suppressing people's prospects, regardless of current social status or educational background. Discuss with reference to texts studied.
- 7. It is too easy to go along with tradition. Discuss with reference to texts studied.
- 8. Accepting fate means no change ever in one's social status. Discuss with reference to texts studied.
