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#### **QUESTION 1**

Read the following poem and then complete the SIX tasks.

- (a) On the text above, mark the places you would pause when speaking this poem aloud to an audience.  
Use | to indicate each pause.

- (b) After which words would you take breath pauses?  
Give two examples, writing the words below.

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- (c) (i) Indicate THREE different ways emphasis may be applied giving examples from the poem.

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- (ii) Indicate ONE place in the poem where it would be appropriate to use a rise in pitch to emphasise. Explain why.

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- (d) Give two examples of RHYME that occur in the poem.

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- (e) Give TWO examples of alliteration that occur in the poem.

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- (f) 'the whole world is awesome with autumn' is repeated THREE times. How would you manage this repetition vocally, so meaning and mood are communicated?

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- (c) Write the following sentence twice on your examination paper. Indicate and explain TWO possible meanings by altering the stress in each example. [7 marks]

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3. Answer ONE of the following.

- (a) (i) Select a character and identify a particular scene in which he/she is involved.
- (ii) Describe the action of the scene and the emotions and thoughts the character has in the scene.
- (iii) How would you adjust physically and vocally to the character in the scene?
- (iv) Use a diagram to show how the scene might be staged. Include any vital props and stage furniture.

- (b) Discuss the vocal and physical skills you consider important when performing with a puppet?  
Use a specific example to support your statements.  
e.g. troll, fairy, bear, etc.

- (c) (i) How would you prepare the content of a two minute talk on a subject of your choice?
- (ii) What do you consider important in the presentation of this talk? Select a specific topic to support your answer.

- (d) You are to tell your favourite fairy story to a pre-school class. What are the vital aspects you will consider so you hold their attention?

You may support your answer with a diagram or drawing.

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
