## **QUESTION 1**

(a) Transcribe the following passage into phonetic script representing Cultivated Australian Speech. Indicate primary stress, vowel length, syllabic consonants, linking [r] and dark[ lÚ] as they occur.

(a) (i) What is the poetic style?

- (iii) Indicate suspensory pauses.
- (iv) What is the basic metre?
- (v) Scan the first two lines of the poem.
- (b) You will notice that the poet sustains the initial idea throughout since he does not use a final pause until the last word.

Discuss what modulative devices you will use to sustain this idea [10 marks] and the overriding mood of the poem to its poignant conclusion.
