QUESTION 1

You are to organise the end of year entertainment at a secondary school with a predominantly multi-cultural population. The programme is to run for ninety minutes.

It is your goal to have all students actively involved.

- (a) Discuss the details of the organisation of the entertainment.
- (b) What strategies would you implement to ensure all students participate?

You have been asked to direct a play reading involving a group of interested senior citizens living in a retirement village.

- (a) How would you select the play?
- (b) Name the play.
- (c) Discuss your approach to the rehearsal of the play.
