20	Candidates should discuss signs of ill health in relation to body parts, diet, behaviour, defecation.	8
	Candidates should outline common signs of ill health, for higher marks they should reference conditions specific to the bearded dragon and named illnesses.	
	Candidates may make reference to the presence of parasites or/and specified illnesses.	
	Candidates should explain the signs and symptoms of common bearded dragon illnesses.	
	Where zoonotic diseases are discussed, the candidate should make reference to the importance of PPE and minimising the spread of the disease.	
	Candidates may make reference to taking the bearded dragon to the vet if disease is suspected.	
	Candidates may make reference to the impact the environmental conditions of the vivarium may have on their health.

0 0 marks	No rewardable material.	
1 1–3 marks	A few key points identified, <b>or</b> one point described in some detail. The answer is likely to be in the form of a list. Only one viewpoint considered. Points made will be superficial/generic and not applied/directly linked to the situation in the question.	
2 4–6 marks	Some points identified, <b>or</b> a few key points described. Consideration of more than one viewpoint but there will be more emphasis on one of them. The answer is unbalanced. Most points made will be relevant to the situation in the question, but the link will not always be clear.	
3 7–8 marks	Range of points described, <b>or</b> a few key points ex depth. All sides of the case are considered and the well-balanced, giving weight to all viewpoints. The points made will be relevant and there will be a cl the situation in the question.	e answer is majority of
