14(b)	Responses may include the following: Reasons for stricter regulation of British newspapers • Greater assurances of privacy for individuals and less intrusion into private lives of public figures • Less chance of newspapers being used as propaganda to influence public opinion to be aligned to the opinions of owners • Better assurances against breach of data protection laws, ensuring that individual's personal information is better protected • Less chance of libellous material that can damage reputations in articles and editorials • Requirement for newspapers and their owners to uphold their moral and ethical obligations • Lack of rigour within current regulation allowing for widespread malpractice (such as the phone-hacking scandal) • Lack of objectivity within current regulation with the Press Complaints Commission being overseen by industry figures who may not be motivated to curtail the practices of the press.	

Reasons against stricter regulations of British newspapers

- Stricter government regulation may lead to the press being regulated to the benefit of the incumbent political party.
- Press should be allowed to publish content that is within the public interest (articles regarding the moral judgement of trusted public figures, for example)
- Stricter regulation would damage the right to free speech and could lead to tightly controlled press such as those in more oppressive regimes.
- Consumers have the choice to ignore salacious personal stories although there is clearly a strong market for this kind of journalism
- Stricter regulation would curtail creativity and may lead to less satirical content
- Stricter regulation would put British newspapers at an unfair disadvantage to online sources of news that are not regulated in the same way.
- There is a tradition of strong investigative journalism in the UK: over-regulation may damage this.

No conclusion produced or the conclusion is a consequence of only one side of the argument being considered.
2 4-6 marks	Arguments for and against are described, but there will be more emphasis on one side than the other. The answer will be unbalanced. A conclusion is present, but this is either implicit or as a result of unbalanced consideration of the arguments. There is little or unfocused justification of the conclusion. Most points made will be relevant to the situation in the question, but the link will not always be clear.
3 7-8 marks	Balanced explanation of both sides for and against. A conclusion is produced which is justified clearly linked to the consideration of arguments for and against, and their relative importance to the situation. The majority of points made will be relevant and there will be a clear link to the situation in the question.





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
