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# **General Marking Guidance**

- All candidates must receive the same treatment. Examiners must mark the first candidate in exactly the same way as they mark the last.
- Mark schemes should be applied positively. Candidates must be rewarded for what they have shown they can do rather than penalised for omissions.
- Examiners should mark according to the mark scheme not according to their perception of where the grade boundaries may lie.
- All marks on the mark scheme should be used appropriately.
- All marks on the mark scheme are designed to be awarded. Examiners should always award full marks if deserved, i.e. if the answer matches the mark scheme. Examiners should also be prepared to award zero marks if a candidate's response is not worthy of credit according to the mark scheme.
- Where some judgment is required, mark schemes will provide the principles by which marks will be awarded and exemplification may be limited.
- When examiners are in doubt about applying the mark scheme to a candidate's response, the team leader must be consulted.
- Crossed-out work should be marked UNLESS the candidate has replaced it with an alternative response.

- ensure those in charge (leaders) are aware of the systems available to support people with mental health issues

### Other considerations

#### The need to:

- increase staffing levels in order to support the wellbeing of the public
- provide specialist officers trained to deal more appropriately with people with mental health issues
- provide nursing staff at stations to care for vulnerable admissions
- provide additional resources to support those with mental health issues
- work more closely with other services (such as ambulance/paramedics) so they know when their services are required at an incident
- work more closely with voluntary organisations in the field of mental health to promote understanding amongst MPS staff
- checking custody records/history of illness
- treat people with respect and not discriminate

	No rewardable material	
Level 1	A few key points identified, <b>or</b> one point described in some detail. The answer is likely to be in the form of a list. Only one viewpoint considered. Points made will be superficial/generic and not applied/directly linked to the situation in the question.	1 to 3
Level 2	Some points identified, <b>or</b> a few key points described. Consideration of more than one viewpoint but there will be more emphasis on one of them. The answer is unbalanced. Most points made will be relevant to the situation in the question, but the link will not always be clear.	4 to 6
Level 3	Range of points described, <b>or</b> a few key points explained in depth. All sides of the case are considered and the answer is well-balanced, giving weight to all viewpoints. The majority of points made will be relevant and there will be a clear link to the situation in the question.	7 to 8
