

## 5. Bedlingham City Farm Waste Policy



Bedlingham City Farm waste disposal procedures.

All animal waste to be taken promptly to the midden (muckheap), which is to be retained behind the confines of the wall.

Waste must be thrown to the back of the midden and periodically this must be tidied and stacked to ensure waste rots down effectively.

All bins around the site must be emptied daily and more frequently in summer and busy periods, waste should have bags sealed and be taken to the skip.

Any food waste from the café should be double bagged to assist in preventing vermin.

#### 6. Burtondale Council Guidelines for Animal Collections



The following measures are to be implemented in zoos in order for a zoo license to be considered.

- 1. Animal collections keeping 'exotic' species must apply for a zoo licence.
- 2. Where a zoo licence is required information must be shared between zoos, captive breeding must take place and education and conservation must be key considerations (see zoo licensing guidelines for full details).
- 3. All animals must be housed in accommodation that is suitable for the species and have good welfare conditions for the particular species.
- 4. All animal accommodation and routines should meet its physical, psychological and social needs, following the Animal Welfare Act 2006 closely.
- 5. A high standard of animal husbandry and suitable preventative care, veterinary care and nutrition should be apparent for all animals in the collection.
- 6. All collections must have systems in place to prevent the escape of animals and procedures to be taken in the event of the escape of animals.
- 7. All collections must have suitable measures in place to deal with infestations and vermin.
- 8. Detailed records of animals' age, health, vaccinations, births and deaths should be available on request.
