Phone the inn to discuss booking rooms, the inn's facilities and to ask about local attractions.
The EXAMINER will start the conversation.

OR

Question 4 (15 marks)

The EXAMINER is a Japanese friend with whom you had planned to go to Disneyland on the weekend.

YOU are an exchange student in Japan, ringing your friend.

- Explain why you cannot go this weekend and suggest alternative arrangements.

YOU will start the conversation.

Question 4 (15 marks)

The EXAMINER is a teacher from Japan visiting your school.

YOU are showing him/her around your school.

- Explain the various school buildings and facilities and school routine.

YOU will start the conversation.
