Querida Cecilia:

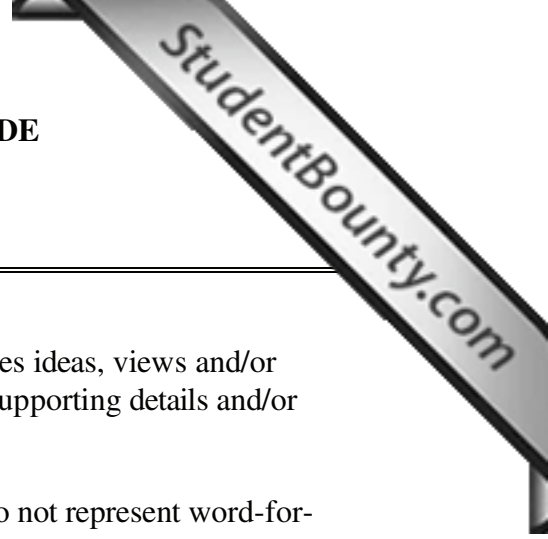

Idiom Idiom is the use of Spanish expressions which do not represent word-for-word translation from English; e.g.,
 – Me divierto
 – Tengo 17 años
 – Me falta(n)

Language

- able to express ideas using appropriate verbal structures and tenses
- sentence structure
- spelling

Completes the task

- Length of response meets the minimum suggested number of words.
- Stays on topic.
