

Larry and Nancy Cooper plan to take Delta Airlines domestic flight, DL3959 on 9 September, leaving Salt Lake City at 08:20 and arriving at San Francisco at 09:15. This connects with the Air China international flight, CA8889, leaving San Francisco at 13:38 and arriving at Beijing at 04:55 (+1 day).

The Coopers will spend the next four days exploring Beijing.

On 14 September, they will leave Beijing on Air China flight CA4138 at 11:45 and arrive in Chongqing at 14:05.

Later that day, they depart on the Yangtze River ferry boat for a river cruise to Yichang.




