Long essays

- 10 'Barack Obama has transformed what it means to be a Democrat.' Discuss. [50]
- 11 'A destructive force in US politics.' Discuss this view of the Tea Party movement. [50]
- 12 'The US is a two party system.' How far do you agree with this view? [50]
