## Introduction

Our examiners' reports are produced to offer constructive feedback on candidates' performance in the examinations. They provide useful guidance for future candidates.

The reports will include a general commentary on candidates' performance, identify technical aspects examined in the questions and highlight good performance and where performance could be improved. The reports will also explain aspects which caused difficulty and why the difficulties arose, whether through a lack of knowledge, poor examination technique, or any other identifiable and explainable reason.

Where overall performance on a question/question part was considered good, with no particular areas to highlight, these questions have not been included in the report.

### General comments on the paper

Entries for the January 2023 series were the highest ever. The mean was slightly lower than those seen in previous January series with an identical standard deviation to January 2022. The 'achieved' boundary was set at 26, the same as in January 2021, and one lower than in January 2022.

#### Assessment for learning



Centres are always advised to focus not only on the knowledge requirements across the five learning outcomes for this unit but also ensure learners are familiar with the different assessment styles used in this summative assessment – i.e., linking boxes, true/false, diagram-related questions and select 'three'. There was a good balance of performance across the learning outcomes in this series.

### Learning outcome 1: questions 1, 4, 7, 9, 11, 18, 20, 25, 30

This LO covers knowledge of hardware components and performance was good. LO1 is one of the weightier LOs within the unit and as a result centres should spend more time with their learners to develop knowledge around types of computer systems, networks, connectivity methods, topologies, network protocols, computer components, devices and fault diagnosis. Learners performed well in identifying hardware but struggled in selecting the best description of a plotter. They also found identifying the characteristics of a router, hub and switch challenging.

### Learning outcome 2: questions 3, 13, 22, 23, 28, 31, 32, 35, 37, 38

Performance on this LO was satisfactory, and this is the heaviest weighted LO within the unit. Learners found two questions more challenging, one of which asked them to identify the features of presentation software and the other to describe the function of Event Viewer. Candidates did manage to identify correct operating systems when presented with a choice of their uses really well.

### Learning outcome 3: questions 10, 12, 15, 16, 17, 24, 27, 36

The focus of LO3 builds on LO1 and LO2 and requires learners to demonstrate knowledge of how to install and upgrade hardware and software. Performance was very good for this learning outcome, with learners understanding the importance of safely handling hardware and understanding the importance of backing up before upgrading software.

### Learning outcome 4: questions 2, 8, 14, 19, 26, 33, 34, 39

Performance on this LO was good, with learners demonstrating a strong knowledge of social media and security. Particularly strong performances were seen in questions about phishing and identifying the correct benefit of managing personal finance. Learners did struggle with a question on the uses of artificial intelligence, however.

### Learning outcome 5: questions 5, 6, 21, 29, 40

This LO carries the lowest weighting in the unit and performance of learners was very good. The LO is holistic in nature and draws together the learning from the unit to reflect on the practical uses of IT within business. The question the learners did the best in was one on how IT can best support business activities such as marketing, analysis and project management.
