Max 2 marks as not an applied answer • I think current tourism is quite a good example of sustainable tourism development because they use old resources (1) such as old plantation houses as hotels(1) and the old railway system has not been destroyed(1) but actually given a new life as part of tourism development(1). Brimstone Fortress has also been maintained(1) which is good for historical reasons(1) • I think the current planned tourism development	Mark
