Phase 1b

Now I'd like you to ask each other [signal] some questions.

(Candidate A), I'd like you to ask (Candidate B) about how he/she travels to college.

(Candidate B), I'd like you to ask (Candidate A) about a sport he/she likes.

Now think about the questions you want to ask. You have one and a half minutes. You can write down your questions if you want to. [Indicate paper and pencil.]

If you don't understand, please ask me.

[Withdraw eye contact to signal start of preparation. Allow 1½ minutes for preparation.]

(Candidate A), are you ready? Please ask (Candidate B) your questions. [Allow up to 2 minutes.]

Thank you.

(Candidate B), are you ready? Please ask (Candidate A) your questions. [Allow up to 2 minutes.]

Thank you.

③ 4 minutes

Phase 2a

In this part of the test, you are going to listen to two recordings and answer some questions. You can make notes *[indicate paper]* if you want to.

You hear some students talking. [Hand each candidate the booklet open at the correct page.] What are the students talking about? A room, a school or a local park?



Listen to the information. [Play CD]

Listening script 1

- A: Do you like where you live?
- B: Yes, I like it. The family that I live with are very kind. The house is near to the shops. I have a large room. It's on the third floor. I have a computer and a desk and so I study there every evening from 6.30 until 9. There are two big windows and I can see the trees in the garden. What about you?

Listening script 2

- A: Where do you like to go in your free time?
- B: I go to the park near my house and walk by the lake. I go there each Sunday when I'm not at school. I like to go out because I don't like sitting in my room. I like to see the flowers and it's very beautiful. I meet my sister and we talk together and sometimes we stay until it's dark.

(Candidate A), in the <u>first</u> recording, what is the student talking about? His room, his school or his local park?

Thank you.

(Candidate B), in the <u>second</u> recording, what is the student talking about? Her room, her school or her local park?

Thank you. [Take back booklets.]

Now listen again, and answer these questions.

(*Candidate B*), in the <u>first</u> recording, what is the house near? [short pause] And what does the student see in the garden?

(*Candidate A*), in the <u>second</u> recording, what day does the student go to the park? [short pause] And who does she meet there?

[Play CD again: scripts as above. At the end of the recording ask each candidate in turn their two questions again. After **each** question, **wait** for the candidate's response.]

③ 3 – 4 minutes Phase 2b

Now you're going to talk together about houses and flats. Tell each other about the house that you live in, and what you like about it.

[Repeat if necessary. Withdraw eye contact to signal start of activity.

Select prompt questions from the list below only when the interaction breaks down. Adapt if necessary. Encourage candidate-candidate interaction by eliciting agreement or alternative opinions from candidates by asking questions such as "What do you think?", "Tell us what you think.", "And you?"]

Houses – prompt questions

Tell us about your favourite room in your house/flat.

How many people live in your house/flat? Who are they?

Tell us about the street where you live.

Where do you want to live in the future?

Thank you. That is the end of the test.

[Ensure candidates DO NOT leave the room with the Candidate's Booklet.]
