Use the shop leaflet to deal with the needs of the customer. ***Explain that you have done some of the activities and what you think of them.***

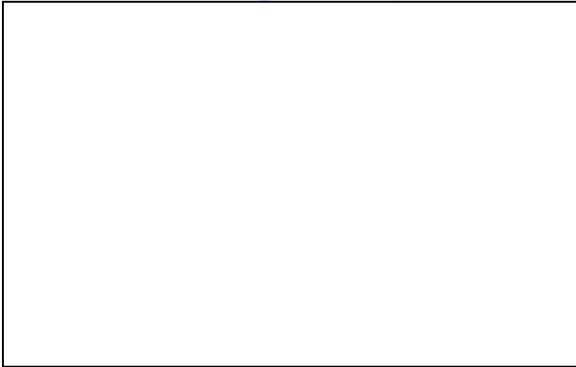
You will need to ask questions to find out what the visitor likes.

Your teacher will play the part of the tourist and will start the conversation.

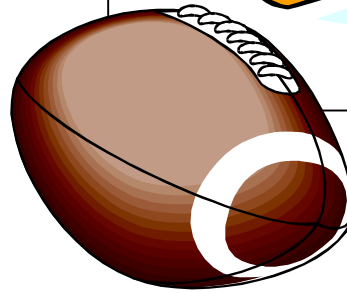
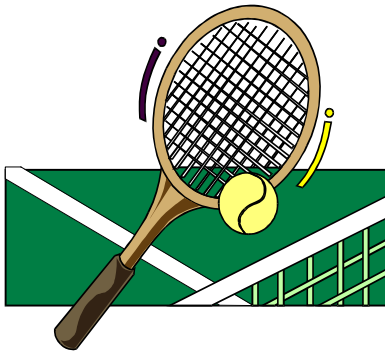

INFORMATION FOR TEACHERS

Task 4

Situation

The candidate should enquire about what you want to purchase and explain about the activities available. **You should encourage the candidate to express opinions about the activities and ask if they have ever done them etc.**

The list below is to help you. It is not intended to be prescriptive or exhaustive. Interaction is expected (not just a succession of questions and answers) and it is hoped that candidates will 'take the lead' after your introduction. Ask any other questions of your own to enable the conversation to flow as naturally as possible. Remember that questions that require yes or no answers should be followed up with a why / where / how question to give the candidate the opportunity to provide more detail. 'H' indicates questions that are generally more suitable for those seeking grades C-A*.

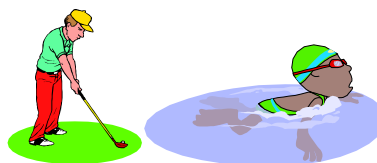

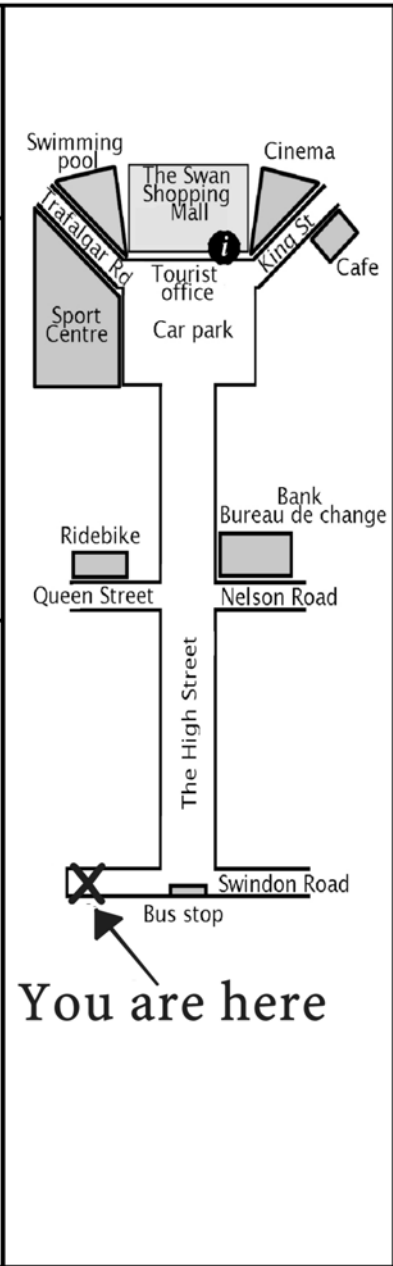

You have a visitor over from a French college who is hoping to organise a trip to England and you talk to him or her about a recent trip you went on and helped to organise.

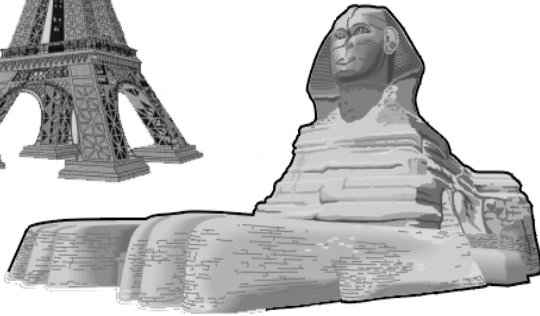
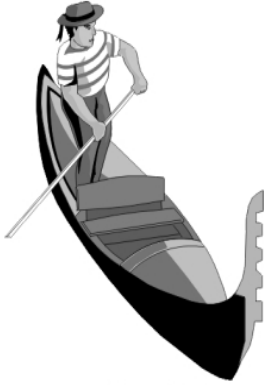
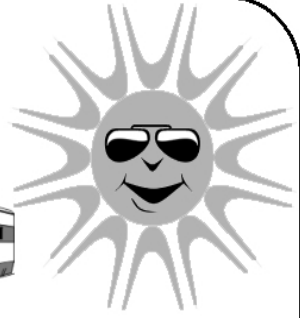
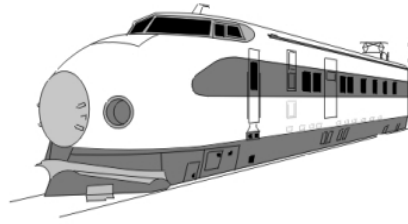
Task
