GCSE Business Studies - Short Course (3503)



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General Marking Guidance

- All candidates must receive the same treatment. Examiners must mark the first candidate in exactly the same way as they mark the last.
- Mark schemes should be applied positively. Candidates must be rewarded for what they have shown they can do rather than penalised for omissions.
- Examiners should mark according to the mark scheme not according to their perception of where the grade boundaries may lie.
- There is no ceiling on achievement. All marks on the mark scheme should be used appropriately.
- All the marks on the mark scheme are designed to be awarded. Examiners should always award full marks if deserved, i.e. if the answer matches the mark scheme. Examiners should also be prepared to award zero marks if the candidate's response is not worthy of credit according to the mark scheme.
- Where some judgement is required, mark schemes will provide the principles by which marks will be awarded and exemplification may be limited.
- When examiners are in doubt regarding the application of the mark scheme to a candidate's response, the team leader must be consulted.
- Crossed out work should be marked UNLESS the candidate has replaced it with an alternative response.

	able to increase its sales - it will need to review factors such as space, capacity and numbers employed if demand is to increase	(6)

(AO1: may be implied) additional capital is the personal investment of the owner - bank loan is a set amount of money for a stated purpose from a bank - medium term can be defined, for example as over 1 year but less than 5 years (3) eg (AO4) (additional capital) Andrew's own money so he will no longer have this available for any other spending/investment - permanent investment in the business - will increase Andrew's stake / will increase the value of the business - no interest paid so it should increase future profits available to Andrew (medium term bank loan) bank agrees / formal arrangement so it is guaranteed - costs are known in advance and can be budgeted for - it has to be repaid/not permanent / only for a medium term eg up to 5 years - interest payments have to be met or the company's future is uncertain (6) (justified decision) loan because OR capital because (10)	4(b)	(10)
