In Didcot there are two main bridges called Cow Lane Bridge and Graffiti Bridge. These bridges are the shortest and easiest way to get to the Ladygrove estate in Didcot and are used by numerous people commuting back and forth to Didcot train station and also coming to and from Didcot town centre, but these bridges are known to be areas of crime, violence and in the case of Graffiti Bridge it can be a popular spot for drug users, this results in the public being scared to travel underneath them, especially at night, because of the reported crimes that are said to happen.

Police do watch these bridges now and again to make sure nothing is happening but, as a police officer we interviewed said, 'they can't patrol under them at all times because they just don't have enough officers to do that.' We want to make people feel safer when walking under these bridges, because its wrong that they feel scared to walk to or from home, so as a result we want to put CCTV under the bridges to help people to feel safer, and also if there are such crimes that are reported going on underneath the bridges then hopefully the CCTV will help to solve who did the crimes or if not solve them definitely help towards finding out who does what and what goes on, because there are still unsolved problems from under the bridges which may be solved with the help of CCTV.

As part of collecting evidence on this issue, we stood by these two bridges and asked one hundred local people walking through the named bridges on what they thought. Our findings showed that:

- 58% of people said they were scared when walking through the bridges
- 87% said they didn't like the way the bridges looked
- 78% of people said they would like brighter lights in the bridges
- 81% said they would feel safer with CCTV under the bridges
- 58% said they would want Cow Lane Bridge to be the one that is changed the most

These figures show that most people agree that there is a problem with the bridges, like crime and violence and the figures clearly show that they definitely want something to be done about the bridges to make them feel safer so the public don't have to worry about their well being and safety. Another point was that if we could just help make the bridges look better that would help people feel better because when something looks unsightly, it doesn't always encourage you to want to go there because it can be slightly intimidating or scary, for example when you see spray painted walls it can make you feel scared because you know groups of children or teenagers have been here being anti-socially spray painting walls.

Also, most people said they would want Cow Lane Bridge to be changed the most, because that tends to be the most 'popular' bridge, and many people walk underneath there, so if that was the only one that we managed to get something done about people wouldn't necessarily mind because not many people walk or use Graffiti Bridge as their main root of travelling around Didcot.

We interviewed a police officer named Janine ; she is in charge of the area around these two bridges called Didcot North. She said that she thinks the bridges are dangerous areas of crime and violence and that she thinks CCTV would be a great help in reducing crime and violence because she knows, from experience of being a police officer around the area, what goes on under these bridges but that the police cant always prove the problems that are reported because she cant catch the problem people red handed with what has been reportedly going on because they only have peoples word for it they don't have something like CCTV evidence to actually prove these things are happening, but if there was CCTV put in place it would definitely help with things and she also mentioned that the police would definitely be willing to cooperate with the campaign and they'd want the CCTV to be put in place.

This is a good point because it shows that the police are backing up our campaign and they are willing to help us. This means something because police officers are the people who tend to be the ones who deal with the area, they are the ones who deal with the issues face to face and they most likely know best about what would and wouldn't be good for the community. Also, I definitely agree with what Janine is saying because she knows what goes on and if she thinks that something needs changing then she is most likely the best person to listen to because she's the one who deals with the issues and I agree that I think having CCTV would help the police to catch people out when things are going on.

As part of the survey, we asked a member of the public, Dominic , what he thought about the campaign and he said that he this is a waste of time and people wont care about the CCT they'll just graffiti back over all the cleaned walls because they'll hide their faces so that they don't get caught.

This is a valid point from a member of the publics point of view, and I see where he is coming from but I disagree with what he is saying because I don't think that people will hide their faces all the time when, for example, burgling somebody, and even if they do hide their face people can still catch them out from the clothes they are wearing. I think that even if CCTV doesn't help catch people out in their crimes, like Dominic is saying, I think it'll at least help people feel safer and everyone has a right to feel safe.

After interviewing the police officer and the member of the public, we asked a victim of an incident under Cow Lane Bridge, Carmen, some questions. She said that she was a little wary of Cow Lane Bridge before the incident, but after the incident had happened she felt really scared, shook up and helpless.

We asked if she thought CCTV would be useful under the bridges she replied "yes and no because it will help lower crimes committed but police wont always take time out to help under the bridges because they have better things to do." She said she thinks CCTV would make people, including her feel safer under the bridges too, because they know that people can be caught.

I agree with what Carmen is saying, because even if CCTV doesn't catch people out all the time, it will help when big cases go on and they can use it as evidence. CCTV will also make many people feel safer, because in our questionnaire we carried out 81% said they'd feel safer with CCTV, but I don't think that I agree with the point about saying police wont have enough time because I'm sure if someone really needed help the police would get to them as soon as they can.

We found some stories online from 'The Oxford Mail' telling us about how there have been violent attacks under Cow Lane Bridge, one was about a 38-year-old man who got dragged off his bike by four 15-year-old boys and three boys aged 16. This was an unprovoked attacked by the boys, who were all drunk, and this most likely wouldn't have happened if there was CCTV under the bridges.

Also, there was another story about a 23-year-old man who was left with a shattered jaw after an attack, this also wasn't needed and I think that CCTV would have stopped the people who did this to him because they would've been scared of getting caught.

Finally the last story was about a man aged between 17 and 19 threatened an 18-year-old man and a 16-year-old girl with a knife to try and get their money, this is anti-social, wrong and I also think this wouldn't have happened if there was CCTV.

I think that CCTV would be a great help, it would make people feel safer when travelling through them, people have a right to feel and be safe and when people are being attacked it shows that people aren't safe, and the council should take responsibility to make sure people are safe e.g. putting in CCTV cameras. I'm quite sure that CCTV would be a big step towards helping out in cases that have happened and may lower crimes under or around these areas. I'm definitely not saying all crimes would be instantly be solved with CCTV, but I think it would help a great deal because all the crimes I mentioned above haven't had the people responsible caught. Another point is that CCTV would help towards showing what type of people need to be questioned

within crimes, what actually happened during the crimes that are being committed and being able to use it as evidence in a court cases.

A campaign is needed on this issue because many citizens are being scared and intimidated within their own environments and I think that it's wrong for people to be scared because people have a right to feel safe. Also, people who are committing the reported crimes, are managing to get away with it because when they do these things there isn't always somebody else around to prove what actually happened and people who commit crimes should have a necessary punishment for their actions and I think the council should take the responsibility to make sure people get caught for the crimes they commit.

As for the campaign methods, I think a few different campaigning methods would be good, for example one campaign method would be an online and a handwritten petition because it would be a great way of getting support and showing people that this is what the public want. I think an online petition would be good for people who use the internet a lot and don't have time to sign a handwritten petition. Whereas a handwritten petition would be good because you can ask people to do it there and then and you know your getting signatures, because if you ask people to go online and sign a petition not everyone will do it, so this way you have a definite supply of people signing a petition. We can then show this campaign to people who have the right power to change what we want and put CCTV in these bridges.

Another way would be to contact the people in power, like the Police, the council, local councillors because these people are the people who can actually get the things we want. We can't just aim this campaign at the public because they can't do anything about what we want to happen. Whereas the council can get the funding, and get the people to put in the brighter lights and CCTV because at the end of the day the council have a responsibility to make people feel safe.

As well as getting hold of the council and the police etc, I think that getting hold of the media would be an excellent way of publicising our campaign and showing the public this is going on. If we managed to get into the Newspaper, on the Radio or the News then more people would see what is going on and then they could join our campaign and agree with it. This would show the council and the police etc. that this is a serious campaign that is within the public interest and it's what people want.

A different way of getting the public involved and showing the people we are aiming our campaign at that we have many people on our side is to set up a Facebook group, I think this would be a good way because Facebook is used by many different aged people, many different types of people from different walks of life and it would get to loads of people in Didcot and people who use the bridges because they can read what we're saying on our page, show their friends and that way more people will join the group and show their support.

I think contacting the media would help best because it will get so many people involved in what we're trying to achieve, and that way we can get our campaign out there to many different people, we can get loads of people to agree to what we're doing and we can then get them to sign our petitions and things and then we can show the council and the police and whoever else that people want this campaign and we can then persuade them to help us because we'll have so many people on our side.

Pupils want safety boost

TEENAGERS have launched a campaign to improve safety at a torious Didcot uderpass.

Pupils at the School said they were scared to walk through the Cow Lane underpass alone, following a series of violent attacks.

Since last July,

Since last July, the underpass has been the scene of 15 crimes, including knifepoint robberies and an attack in which a man had his jaw roken.

As part of their As part of their As part of their citizenship, the students have launched a poster campaign, collected 120 signatures on a petition, met with local police and conducted a survey of 100 under pass users.



Of the people questioned, 81 said they would feel safer if the underpass had CCTV. Natasha

TEENAGERS have launched a campaign to improve safety at a notorious Didcot underpass.

Pupils at School said they are scared to walk through the Cow Lane underpass alone following a series of violent attacks.

The Year 10 pupils are calling for CCTV and better lighting to boost safety in the dingy bway.


Since July, the underpass has been the scene of 15 crimes, including knifepoint robberies and an attack in which a man's jaw was shattered.

As part of their GCSE in citizenship, the students have launched a poster campaign, collected a 120-signature petition, met police officers and conducted a survey of 100 underpass users.

Eighty one of the people questioned said they would feel safer if the underpass were monitored by CCTV.

Natasha (15, of 15) said: "I have to use the underpass everyday and it is very scary. My mum won't let me walk there at night.

"There have been a lot of robberies, and it can be really intimidating. When there is a gang

We had a discussion with Tony who is the Deputy Leader of the town council. The topics we discussed were:

- What our Campaign in (CCTV and brighter lights)

- Said what we'd done to get our campaign known about (e.g. Facebook, website, petition, website, posters and newspaper)

We then spoke about the issue of whether our campaign could ever become possible and he said that:

- He's in discussions with South Oxfordshire District Council and Oxfordshire County Council.

- He then has to get in touch with the railway stations about the ownership of the bridge.

- It is happening, but it takes time and could take up to a year to complete.

- Also that they will most likely not be able to get CCTV

- But they are trying to get brighter lights and clean up the bridge.

He then ended the discussion by saying that he'd back our campaign if we ever needed him to come along to anything, and that he'd contact us if anything started to happen with our issue.

For our Citizenship campaign we campaigned for a local issue around Didcot which was to get CCTV and brighter lights under a notoriously scary and dark bridge which has been known for crime called Cow Lane Bridge.

Our campaign had a large impact on people around Didcot because we made more people aware of the problem, and for people who already thought that this was an issue they had a way of raising their voices and letting people know their thoughts. We managed to get the Police to back up our campaign, because as part of our research they said that they thought this was a good idea. Also, we got our campaign known to people by using the local media and on the Didcot Herald website people left comments saying things such as "We have enough money for 'Lady grove Loop'. Perhaps it would be better spent on the safety of the townsfolk, rather than this strange fitness trail." I think this is a good point because it shows that a member of the public agrees with our idea, and that they think more money on crime, such as CCTV and brighter lights under Cow Lane Bridge.

We also made people know about our issue by getting people to sign up to things and show they supported us, for example we have:

- Over 100 members on our Facebook group.
- Over 70 signatures on our online petition.
- Just over 200 people signing our handwritten petitions

This shows that we have made at least 300 aware of our campaign and most of them will agree with what we're doing.

Evaluating my plan I think that it was well thought out and well planned. We tried to get each of our members as involved as we could, and use each person's strengths and weaknesses to the best of our abilities to make sure everybody was involved and had a part to play. We are all quite confident and knew what we preferred to do, so me and Charley called people to arrange things and gather information whereas Elli sent emails and made posters. We all got involved in all these parts but some people did more things than that of others. Also, we all made sure we created at least one thing like the Facebook group, website and online petition. Some things in our plan took more time than we hoped, for example when we wanted to speak to somebody about who Cow Lane Bridge belonged too we couldn't get through to people so we couldn't quite work out who we had to aim our campaign at. Some things also took a lot of organising to do, like getting into the local papers and getting hold of councillors.

Our aim, which was, 'To get brighter lights and CCTV under Cow Lane Bridge and Graffiti bridge in Didcot' was successful in most wavs because we had a discussion with the Deputy Leader of the Town Council, Tony and he said that he's in discussion with South Oxfordshire District Council and with Oxfordshire County Council about getting brighter lights and cleaning the bridges up. I think this is great because it means that we've raised a problem to the public and managed to get ourselves heard within the council, and even if it takes a year to get completed, we will have completed our aim and managed to make people feel safer within Didcot which I personally think is a great achievement. I also think our campaign went well because we managed to get over 300 people to back up our campaign, and one of those people were Ed who is our local MP who we managed to sign our online petition.

Then we got ourselves into The Didcot Herald newspaper and online website, and we got on thr Oxford Mail website with our story, which shows also that people think our campaign is good and although we don't know how many people were impacted by the papers, we can tell it was good from what have been said by friends and family who saw the articles.

Although some aspects of our campaign could have gone better, for example we were emailed by Charlotte who was from BBC Oxford News and she sounded interested in our campaign and asked if they were allowed permission to get us to talk on both Radio and TV we replied to her but unfortunately heard nothing back. Also, we never actually managed to get CCTV because in our discussion with Tony he said that he thought CCTV was a step too far and only Brighter lights and cleaning it up would be possible. Even though we haven't actually completed our aim it is in working progress. CCTV would have been great, but we have got some things happening which is one good thing that's come out of this.

If we were to do another campaign and do things differently I think we'd try harder to have a discussion with an MP or councillor sooner into our campaign and carry on from there. I think we'd try handing out more posters and talking to more people in person about how they feel about this issue. Other than that, I'm happy with how our campaign went and how we went about things.

The next steps in our campaign would be to organise an official meeting with South Oxfordshire District Council and Oxfordshire County Council members and that way we could speak to all the right people, and see where to go from there. We could also carry on getting ourselves out into the public, getting signatures and more people to back up our campaign. That would then show a great public interest in our campaign and hopefully make things happen sooner.
