- Cheaper
- Immaculate surface finish
- Self coloured
- Ideal for quantity production
- Durable
- Weatherproof
- Lightweight (1 x 1 mark)

Award **one** mark for a low level response:

- Paint
- Varnish
- Oil

Award two marks for any suitable specific finish.

Possible responses:

- Natural
- Wax
- Polyurethane Varnish (Trade names acceptable)
- Stain
- Teak Oil (2 x 1 mark)

Question 7

(a) Award **one** mark for each feasible question

Possible responses:

Do you have a patio?

Do you sit outside?

Do you eat outside in summer?

Do you prefer wood, metal or plastic garden furniture?

How much would you be prepared to pay for a set of patio furniture? (2 x 1 mark)

(b) Award **one** mark a correct advantage

Possible responses:

- Less expensive
- More colourful
- Waterproof
- Easier to keep clean
- Easier to store

• Weight related (1 x 1 mark)

(a) Award **one** mark each for **three** advantages

Possible responses: - Can relate to home use

- They take up less space
- They are easier to handle
- They are easier to stack
- They are easier to transport
- The manufacturer does not have to employ people to assemble the furniture
- Easier to assemble (3 x 1 mark)
- (b) Award up to **two** marks depending upon the quality of each explanation

	Explanation: The box weighs 25 kg.
	Importance: The box is heavy and care should be taken when lifting it.
Umbrella	
	Explanation: The box should be protected from the rain. Importance: If the box is not protected the box and its contents may suffer

Adhesive catches fire	Fire burns someone/sets building on fire/gives off toxic fumes	Do not use near a flame
Adhesive comes into contact with eyes	Adhesive irritates eyes	Wear safety glasses

Award two marks for any suitable specific wood / metal

Possible responses:

- MDF
- Any suitable close grain hardwood
- Aluminium
- Steel

• Resin mould (2 x 1 mark)

(c) Award **one** mark each for any part of the process which is in the correct sequence

Place the former/mould in the machine
Lower the former/mould
Heat the plastic sheet
Raise the former/mould
Switch on to vacuum
Cool and remove the former/mould
