- to give factual information **and** to explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others);
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

- 2 details about the concerts you like (e.g. where/musicians/type of music);
- 3 details about a concert you went to or plan to go to, and how you feel about it;
- 4 whether or not you think concerts are worth the money and why;
- 5 what kind of evening out you would like next and why.

- to give factual information **and** to explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others);
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

- 2 a description of pets you know (e.g. colour/size/personality);
- 3 a description of a visit you made or plan to make to a zoo or animal centre, and how you feel about it;
- 4 whether or not you think zoos are a good thing and why;
- 5 what work you would like to do in the future and why.
