SECTION A: READING POETRY FROM DIFFERENT CULTURES

This section relates to Section 1 of the AQA *Anthology* labelled 2005 onwards that you have been using during the course.

Answer **one** question from this section on the poems you have studied in Section 1 of the *Anthology*: Poems from Different Cultures (pages 5–18).

You are advised to spend about 45 minutes on this section.

EITHER

1 How does the poet use words to create pictures of places in 'Island Man' (page 7)? Compare this with the way a picture of a place or places is created in **one** other poem of your choice from the Poems from Different Cultures.

Write about:

- where the places are
- what you find out about the places
- similarities between the methods used to present the places in the two poems
- differences between the methods used to present the places in the two poems
- what you think about the places and how they are presented.

2 Compare the methods the poets use to get across their points of view in 'Half-Caste' (page 13) and **one** other poem of your choice from the Poems from Different Cultures.

Write about:

- what the points of view are
- the methods that are used to get across these points of view
- similarities between the methods the poets use
- differences between the methods the poets use
- what you think about the points of view.

3 Choose something you are interested in and know about. Write about it in a way which will **inform** other people.

Remember to:

- choose carefully what to write about
- give a range of information
- write to inform.

OR

4 Think about a decision you, or someone close to you, has made that has changed your life or the lives of other people. **Explain** what the decision was and the changes it brought about.

Remember to:

- choose a decision that has caused change
- explain what the decision was
- explain how it changed your life or other people's lives.
