
### San Francisco and the Bay Area

# Nairobi - one of the poorest cities in Africa

Migration and a high rate of natural increase have made Nairobi one of the fastest growing cities in Africa. Over 60% of the population of Nairobi live in slums. Kibera, one of fifty slum areas across the city, is home to nearly one million people and is described as 'the biggest slum in Africa'. A resident of Kibera said, "People who live here do not have clean running water, sanitation systems, electricity or services. There are no health facilities. There is a real need for improvement schemes in Kibera."

The rate of infant mortality (child deaths) in slum areas is over three times the rate in other parts of the city.


