
How might your candidates' journey through the new GCSE 2009 Geography B differ to that taken through the old B specification?

Modular -	greater flexibility in sitting exams when your students are ready and opportunities to improve at a later stage
Resits -	
	only one resit opportunity for each unit is available
Terminal requirement -	at least 40% of the entire GCSE must be completed at the end of the course - this means for GCSE Geography B: Evolving Planet full course (2GB01) at least two units must be taken in the final examination session. For the short course (3AR01) only one unit must be taken when certification is requested.
Uniform Mark Scores	candidates' best marks are stored for aggregation aat the end of the course, ensuring their best performance is awarded, however the scores for the units being used to satisfy the terminal rule will be used even if they are lower than those held in the bank all units are assessed at the GCSE standard in whichever exam series they are offered


