Specification

The same theme will be set in June and the following January, but with different titles and resource booklets.

Controlled assessment

Please be reminded that centres should select both the Fieldwork Focus and the Geographical Investigation from the same set of titles (the one for the year in which they plan to submit the work to OCR). Both tasks must be submitted together.

Controlled assessment re-sits

Candidates taking Specification B can enter controlled assessment in January or June. The titles are the same in the same calendar year. If candidates want to re-sit to improve their mark, they must follow the JCQ procedures, which make it clear that for a re-sit of controlled assessment the work must be entirely new.

For a candidate who submitted their controlled assessment in January and wants to re-sit it in June of the same calendar year, the centre must ensure that the work for both parts of the controlled assessment is entirely new. A candidate may not just redraft their original work.

The Geographical Investigation must be on a new task. However, for the Fieldwork Focus, it may be difficult to change the task, given that it will probably be related to a field trip. If this is the case, the candidate may use the original data collected, but the write-up must be entirely new and must be completed without access to the work submitted the first time. The work that they do on analysis and evaluation (high level of control) must be conducted under controlled conditions, as for the first attempt.

For a candidate who wants to re-sit the controlled assessment the following calendar year, the tasks set for both the Geographical Investigation and the Fieldwork Focus will be different from those of the previous year and the candidate will, of course, have to complete entirely new work.
