Write 90 – 100 words **in German**.

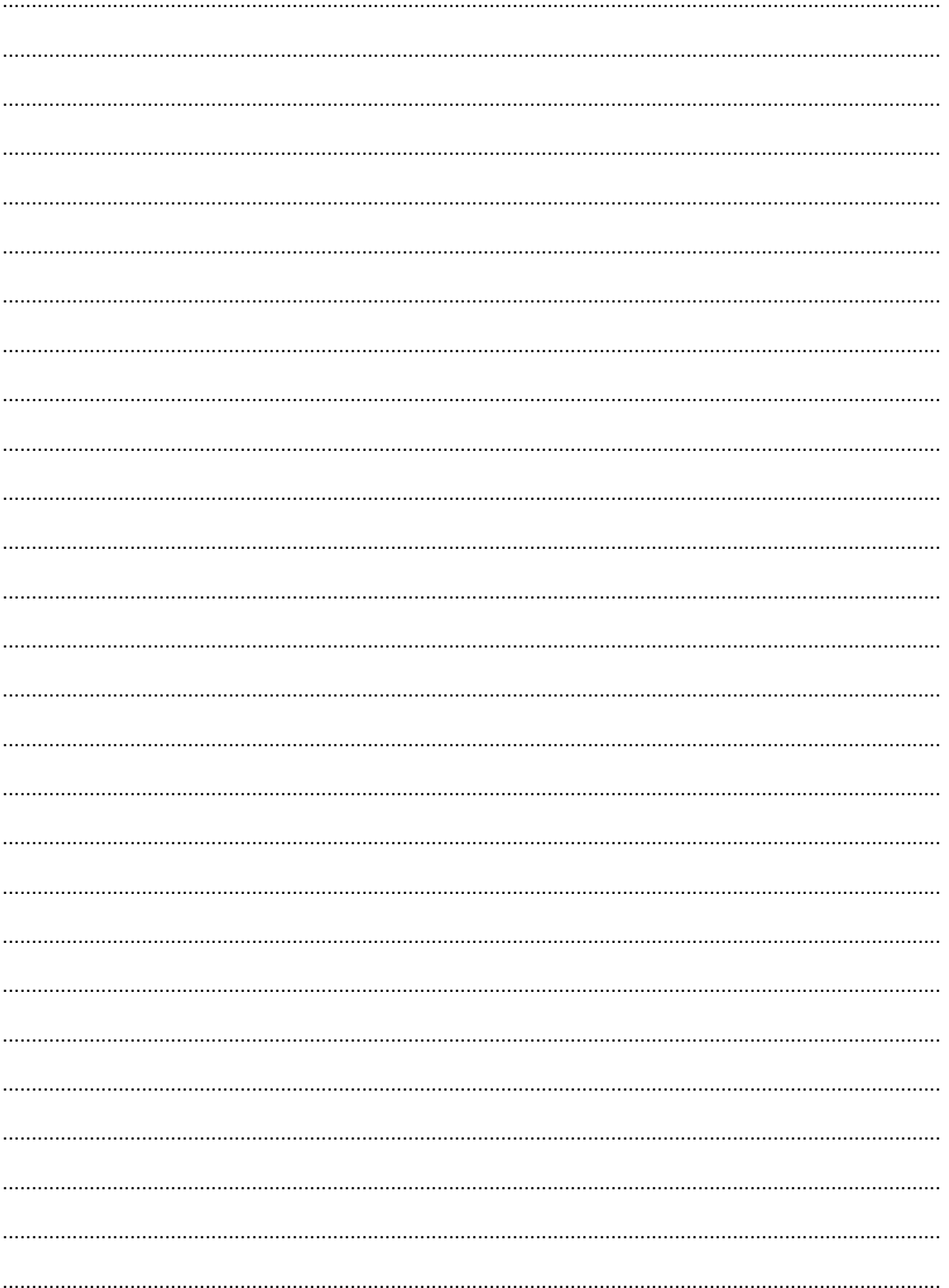
