- **After the two role plays you will do a Presentation, for about one minute, on a subject you have prepared.**
- **The rest of the Speaking test will consist of a Discussion of the Presentation with your teacher, and finally, two General Conversation topics.**

SECTION 1

SITUATION: You are in a café in Germany. Your teacher will play the part of the waiter / waitress and start the conversation.

You will have to:

- 1 ask for a table
- 2 say for how many people
- 3 ask for something to eat
(e.g. cake / sausage / ice-cream)
- 4 ask for something to drink

SECTION 2

SITUATION: You are in the lost property office in Germany. Your teacher will play the part of the official and start the conversation.

You will have to:

- 1 say what you have lost (e.g. purse / wallet / bag)
- 2 say where you lost the item
- 3 answer the question
- 4 describe the lost item (give TWO details)
