- (a) Explain the relevance of utilitarianism to liberalism. [10]
- (b) Assess whether liberals are more divided by debates about the role of the state than by any other aspect of liberal ideology. [30]

2. SOCIALISM

- (a) Explain the importance of the concept of social justice within socialism. [10]
- (b) 'The failure of socialist economics is the main reason for the decline of socialism.' Discuss. [30]

3. CONSERVATISM

- (a) Explain why conservatism can be described as a pragmatic ideology. [10]
- (b) Evaluate the view that conservatives are more divided about the concept of organic society than any other issue. [30]

4. NATIONALISM

- (a) Explain the importance of ethnicity in defining a nation. [10]
- (b) Analyse the extent to which nationalism is always expansionist. [30]
