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Introduction

The examination paper, the third in the series, is the synoptic paper for the Double Award qualification. The paper consists of three questions based on a scenario. Each question is divided into two different types - short answer questions requiring candidates to apply knowledge and extended writing questions which require candidates to formulate their knowledge and apply it in a coherent, balanced argument which reads logically. It was pleasing to note the preparation of the candidates by the centres for this examination as they appeared to be well prepared and able to write reasoned extended responses. The paper has been prepared in such a way as to discriminate between candidates; the mark scheme has been devised to provide access to all candidates. The paper accurately reflects the unit specification.

Question 1 (a)

This question asked candidates to identify two other needs, having given a hint in the question stem by naming social needs. A number of candidates did not take note of this hint and failed to answer the question correctly.




No marks were awarded because the candidate did not identify two other needs; they failed to answer the question.



Ensure that candidates read the questions carefully and look for any helpful hints in either the scenario or the question stem.

Question 1 (b)


This question builds on the theme of social needs that were identified in 1(a) and asks candidates to describe how social networking sites may meet these needs. Examiners were looking for responses such as the ability to develop and maintain relationships which would then improve self-confidence, raise self-esteem and provide Camille with a sense of belonging. Candidates who only identified the development of relationships scored marks in level 1 whereas those who were able to identify relevant points and then fully describe them scored marks in level 2.

Four marks were awarded for this answer. The candidate identified the ability to develop and maintain relationships, developing their answer further by describing the effect of this on Camille's social needs.

Question 1 (c)

A number of candidates experienced difficulties in answering this question as they found it challenging to convey their understanding of how Camille's self-concept could be affected by the publication of photographs of her on a social network site appearing drunk. The response below is a good example of a candidate who understood the question but was not awarded full marks as they did not provide a balanced argument.

Five marks were awarded to this candidate. The top paragraph describes anger leading to low self-esteem and then a low self-concept brought on by what people think of her. The bottom paragraph discusses how she does not want to be judged but wants to be popular - fitting in.



Try to have a balanced viewpoint written in a well structured format.

6 marks were awarded to this candidate for this full answer. Their answer is coherent and well-structured. Links have been made between Camille's actions and the effects this has had upon her self-concept.

Four marks were awarded for this answer. The candidate discusses how Camille will be embarrassed which affects her self-esteem and self-image and the effect of this is she will not want to go out anymore with her friends.

Question 1 (d)

This question required candidates to assess how the photographs of Camille may affect her relationship with her parents. As the command verb is 'assess' it is important in order to attain marks in level 3 that the candidates provide both a positive and negative response as to how it may affect Camille's relationship with her parents and a conclusion.

6 marks were awarded to this candidate, which places the answer at the top of level 2 mark band. The candidate has identified that the parents may support Camille and the effect of them talking to her is that it may bring them closer together which is positive for her self-concept.



For a level 3 answer the examiners were looking for a link between how the parents may react - cause arguments, become distant and the effects this may then have on their relationship with Camille. For extended writing questions, a conclusion will usually gain candidates at least one extra mark even if it is just a simple statement or summary.

Two marks were awarded to the candidate for this level 1 response. They have correctly identified conflict and strain but there is no development of these two points.



For the candidate to move into the level 2 mark band they needed to have correctly identified two points - to go onto explain how the relationship between Camille and her parents may be then be affected.

Question 2 (a)

Definitions of key terms are often used in examination papers. They provide the examiner with the means to test the candidates' recall abilities.

The candidate scored 2 marks for this answer. They gave their definition of the key term care values and supported it with examples of the ways that care practitioners apply it to their work with service users.



Definitions of key terms supported by examples of how they can be applied as in this case often secure the marks for candidates as it clearly demonstrates their understanding of the term.

Question 2 (b)

In the GCSE specification, part of the criterion of 4.2: Care values commonly used in practitioner work requires the candidate to demonstrate their understanding of how these care values are implemented in a care practitioner's work. This question requires the candidates to recall two of the care values and then apply them to the case study in the given scenario.

Full marks (4 marks) were awarded to this candidate for this good answer. They correctly identified two of the care values and described how they may be used by the care practitioner with the named service user.



Candidates should know what the different care values are. As part of a class activity get them to apply the care values to different case studies and scenarios.

Question 2 (c)

Many candidates struggled with this question as they failed to focus their answer on the effects of discrimination and exclusion on service users. A large number of candidates examined the effects of discrimination on service users only and failed to mention exclusion on them.

The candidate was awarded 7 marks, level 3 mark band. Their response is coherent and well-structured.

The candidate scored 3 marks for their level 1 response. It was weak as they only focused on the effects of discrimination and did not include the effects of exclusion on the service user.



It is important that the candidate's response addresses the question being asked. If they only partially answer the question then they will only achieve marks in the lower mark band levels.

Question 2 (d)

The focus of this question was empowerment and how it may affect an individual's growth and development. Overall it was not well answered as candidates appeared to struggle with the concept of empowerment.

For this level 2 answer the candidate was awarded 5 marks. They had identified some points and had begun to develop their answer linking empowerment with growth and development through PIES.



It is important that candidates fully understand empowerment and how it may affect the growth and development of a service user.

This candidate was not awarded any marks for their response, they do not appear to understand what empowerment is.



Whilst the candidate correctly structured their answer using PIES as it was a growth and development question, because they did not understand the term empowerment it was of not help to them.

In his supportive relationship with her he is raising her awareness of the effects on her health and well-being of drinking alcohol. 4 marks were awarded to this candidate. They have discussed the support that Ross can offer Camille and developed their answer to include how he is going to do this and the effect this may then have on her.



Ensure the candidates understand lifestyle choices and the support that may be available to them when making those choices through positive relationships.

Question 3 (b)

This question asks candidates to describe how being in a relationship can help maintain a positive self-image. As self-image is clearly stated in the question stem the candidates' answers must relate to this.

This answer is repetitive and one mark was awarded for making Camille feel confident.





The candidate was awarded 3 marks for the first answer and 1 mark for the second as they repeat the question stem.



It is important for candidates to not repeat the question stem in their answer but to use it as a checklist. They should re-read the stem after they have written their answer to check that they have not left anything out that it has asked them to do.

7 marks were awarded to this candidate for their level 3 answer. The candidate has attempted to make valid links with an individual's right to make their own lifestyle choices.



Candidates should be encouraged to ensure that they have sufficient time to answer every question on the exam paper and to read the stem very carefully. Some candidates did not read the question properly and did not discuss in their answer the importance for an individual of making their own lifestyle choices.

Examiner Comments

Paper Summary

Candidates appear to have been well prepared for this paper, the questions discriminating well across all levels and calibre of learners.

The following comments may be beneficial in helping candidates to improve upon their performance:

- Read the case studies and questions carefully.
- Ensure that the candidates answer the question asked and encourage them to keep referring back to the question stem to ensure that they are still addressing the question being asked.
- Recall knowledge accurately, learning key terms and specialist language.
- When constructing an extended response candidates should be encouraged to make links and write conclusions.
- Use PIES appropriately.
- The number of lines allocated to each question should provide candidates with a clear indication of how to plan their response. The more lines there are provided, the more marks allocated to that question and the more in-depth your answer should be.
- Practice past exam papers, paying particular attention to time. A number of the extended writing questions had not been attempted by some very good candidates which is an indicator that they ran out of time. Encourage candidates to attempt every question.

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
