

Mr Cobden says that the Chartists are a small and powerless party. There are people in Lancashire and Yorkshire who can tell him a different story. We are no Chartists. We have no wish to over-rate the importance of the Chartists. But those who gather in tens of thousands to demonstrate their support for a political principle are neither small nor insignificant.

The Government is now getting very uneasy about Chartist demonstrations in various parts of the country, especially in London. It is worried by the repeated meetings and marchings of great bodies of men.
