

More information on Smoking

Smoking - 2 harmful chemicals in smoke - nicotine which increases the baby's heartbeat and Carbon monoxide which replaces Oxygen in the baby's blood. All this passes through the placenta.

- * Babies are smaller in weight and weaker.
 - * Smokers more likely to have miscarriage.
 - * Smokers more likely to suffer from bronchitis and pneumonia.
 - * Babies brain cells are likely to be damaged in later pregnancy.
 - * Babies more at risk to cot death
- Old passive smoking can cause cancers e.g. leukaemia.

SMOKING

Quite simply, try to stop smoking for your own, and your baby's, well being. Smoking during pregnancy can affect your baby's development. Premature labour is more common among women who smoke and nicotine is transmitted to your baby if you smoke while breastfeeding. Smoking may also be a contributory factor in cot death and babies growing up in households where there is a smoker, are more likely to suffer from chest infections.
