Specimen investigative task

that are evident. Choose a range of baby changing units to investigate. Plan and visit a
range of establishments. Collate your findings making realistic recommendations for
improvements. Evaluate, and display your conclusions in a logical and structured manner.

Specimen practical tasks

- Find a way which enhances awareness in a multi cultural society of the importance of immunisation in children under five. (For example leaflet, magazine, article). Evaluate all aspects of the task and its success.
- You have been asked to baby sit for two children aged three and five years old for five hours on a Saturday. Plan the lunch, activities and routine required to give them an interesting and safe experience. Evaluate the outcome of your task and draw logical conclusions.
